

# WEEKLY BULLETIN 30 Jan 2017

### **General Updates**

- The NRA has authorised the disbursement of almost 12 billion NPRs for the second tranche of the housing reconstruction grant. The second tranche disbursement will be made through MoFALD CL-PIU and DL-PIUs across the fourteen most affected districts. The second tranche is disbursed once construction up to plinth level has been completed and inspection (following the inspection SOP) finds the work to be compliant. The request for disbursement was originally for just over 26 billion NPRs, but for now only 12 billion NPRs has been approved for release. - NRA CEO, Dr. Govinda Raj Pokhrel has stated that grievances will be addressed immediately. A Central Level
  Grievances Committee has been formed and is working to address all grievances by 7 February. The full news

• New Joint Secretary Yam Lal Bhusal (transferring from Ministry of Industry) has joined NRA central, effectively filling the post that was vacant after the departure of Ram Thapaliya (Policy, Planning, Monitoring, and Development Assistance Coordination Division).

- A total of 435 engineers, sub-engineers, and assistant sub engineers from Kathmandu, Bhaktapur, Lalitpur and Kavrepalanchok have been trained on the Inspection SOP by MoUD CL-PIU. The training sessions were conducted over 14 days from 8 - 23 Jan 2017 and the technicians were orientated on the different types of forms and the detailed procedures for filling the forms. HRRP, SABAL, and JICA also provided trainers for this event.
- HRRP and the Common Feedback Project (CFP) will be strengthening our collaboration to maximise the impact on the reconstruction efforts of the local level feedback and perceptions collected by the CFP. As part of this we will be jointly organising monthly meetings (tentatively scheduled for the last Monday of every month) where CFP will present questions collected and provide an overview of the survey findings. CFP and HRRP will then jointly present a more in-depth look at 3-5 of the findings and then potential actions to address these can be discussed, and commitments to act on this made where possible. The first meeting is planned for the end of February, and we will circulate more detailed information on this soon. Based on the latest round of <u>4W data</u>, only 9 VDCs have full coverage of the technical assistance package in all wards. The remaining 610 VDCs are not receiving the full package of Technical Assistance (TA) support required. There are 202 VDCs in total that do not have any TA activities reported, of which 134 VDCs have more than 60% of damaged structures.

Please note that the approach of the NRNA is to directly construct the houses, i.e. not to follow the owner driven approach.

## **Meetings and Events**

- A "Livelihood Orientation and Grievances Management Interaction" was organised by the NRA on 27th Jan 2017 in Dhulikhel, Kavre. The major grievances in the district were collected from various stakeholders including government bodies, Partner Organisations, press, and local authorities. CEO Dr. Govinda Raj Pokharel summarised the NRA's plans to facilitate and speed up the reconstruction process. Three working papers on Dignified Livelihood, Grievance Adressal Mechanism, and NRA: Introduction, Work Process, and Guidelines were presented by NRA representatives. The HRRP District Coordinator for Kavre is preparing a summary of the interaction session which will be shared soon.
  - District orientations for Partner Organisations (POs) on the Inspection SOP have now been completed in 10 districts. 



- Household WASH: We <u>still have not received anything</u> following last week's request for partners to **share existing toilet designs or WASH information materials** that have been developed. We would greatly appreciate it if you could share any materials you have on this with Kuber (<u>techofficer.national@hrrpnepal.org</u>) and Laxmi (<u>techofficer2.national@hrrpnepal.org</u>). This will not only benefit development of standards for household WASH in relation to the 25,000 NPRs of the housing grant linked with this, but may also support with common review and approval of toilet designs and WASH information materials through NRA.
