Ward No.5, Bhumlu Rural Municipality, Kavrepalanchok: two roomed, brick and cement mortar masonry house. The home owner has received all three tranches of the GoN housing reconstruction grant. After receiving the third tranche, the owner modified the houses by adding extra pillars in the lobby space and added a storey with four rooms. - In Ramechhap, NRCS are planning to provide Social Technical Assistance (STA) in areas not covered by other POs. This is a fantastic initiative to cover gaps and HRRP will be following up with NRCS HQ to understand the possibilities of a similar approach in other districts.
- In Nuwakot, Oxfam was planning to build 244 houses for displaced households, but the households have already rebuilt on their hazardous site. The NRA has instructed that the households should return the funds received through the GoN housing reconstruction grant in order to receive the planned support from Oxfam. Oxfam requested that a decision on this be issued as soon as possible.

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

Districts & Municipalities

HRRP District and Municipal Coordination Meetings, 14 – 27 September: during this period district coordination meetings took place in Dhading (20 September), Dolakha (24 September), Kavrepalanchok (27 September), Ramechhap (27 September), and Nuwakot (28 September). Municipal level meetings took place in Jiri Municipality, Dolakha (21-22 September), Bhumlu Rural Municipality, Kavrepalanchok (20-21 September), and Dhansing Rural Municipality, Nuwakot (26 September). Some of the highlights from these meetings include:

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


- In **Dhading**, a sector wise mapping of Partner Organisations (POs) was carried out during the meeting. The mapping detailed working areas, activities, timelines, and groups that the POs are working with.
- In **Dolakha**, NRA and GMALI, Building, and Education DLPIUs requested the NSET Baliyo Ghar Programme to conduct retrofitting training for newly recruited technical staff. The GMALI chief requested all POs to coordinate with the GMALI DLPIU office before implementing any activities. They also requested POs to include support for vulnerable households in their activities so that they can meet the deadlines for tranche disbursement set by the NRA Steering Committee.
- In Kavrepalanchok, GMALI highlighted that none of the households eligible for the retrofit grant have
 received the second tranche but the disbursement of the reconstruction is progressing well. However,
 many of the government technical staff (engineers, sub-engineers, assistant sub-engineers) deployed in
 the district have not received any training (see NRA, Building DLPIU Technical Staff Survey Report for more
 details). HRRP will coordinate with CARITAS and DUDBC to organise a ToT for the technical staff.
- In Ramechhap, POs provided progress updates. NRCS is planning to provide Social Technical Assistance (STA) in areas not covered by other POs. Out of 1,510 non-compliance cases registered the DSE has provided corrections for 1,232 and of these 687 have received the tranches after applying corrections.
- In **Nuwakot**, discussion focused on the 377 households living on hazard prone sites and many of these households have already rebuilt their house on the hazardous site. In Kimtang and Dupchesswar, 190 householdss have bought land in another place but they have also received the third tranche for the house they rebuilt on the hazardous site. Oxfam was planning to build 244 houses for households displaced by geo-hazards but these households have already rebuilt on their hazardous site. The NRA has instructed that the households should return the funds received through the GoN housing reconstruction grant in order to receive the planned support from Oxfam. Oxfam requested that a decision on this be issued as soon as possible. Similarly, Chair of DCC Nuwakot, requested all the POs to focus on infrastructure development in coordination with local government.
- In Wards 3 and 9, Jiri Municipality, Dolakha, the meeting focused on concerns about water shortages as water sources dried up after the earthquake (this is an issue that has come up in many areas, see www.cfp.org.np for more information). The local authorities and affected communities have requested POs to support with rectifying the water sources. In ward 9 the health post was built on private land but now the ward chairperson has committed to buy land for the health post and Building DLPIU has committed to support the construction. Other issues raised included, two timber houses that are compliant with the building code facing delays in tranche disbursement, some households whose houses were destroyed in the earthquake are not on the eligible list, and land issues including multi-ownership and houses on vulnerable / hazardous land.
- In **Bhumlu Rural Municipality, Kavre,** meetings were conducted in 8 wards. There are a high number of non-compliances and the technical staff are finding many households do not want to carry out the required corrections. There are a number of households on the list for the retrofit grant that wish to switch to the reconstruction grant. There is a need for awareness programmes regarding the need to receive Completion Certificate. There are delays in tranche release and some files are missing from the DLPIUs. Reconstruction in urban areas such as Dolalghat is relatively slow. There are households that have built between road and river which violates bylaws and as a result their files have not been approved for subsequent tranches. In places like Bhumlutar, some households listed on land at risk from geo-hazards have requested support to build an integrated settlement. Also, in Bhumlutar, enrollment started late as beneficiaries had no land certificates and they were enrolled using Land Bills (Nissa). This has led to encroachment of public lands. There are also no valid land documents in the entire ward which is a major setback to stop public land encroachment.
- In **Dhansing Rural Muncipality, Nuwakot**, the meeting focused on planning how to solve non-compliances and support vulnerable households and how municipal and PO resources could be used to support with this.

Ward No.9, Chandragiri Municipality, Kathmandu: three storey, RC frame structure. Lumanti are providing support to the home owner who had faced issues due to conflict regarding ownership of the land but has now been able to proceed with the housing reconstruction grant process.

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Requests for Partner Support

Call for sector-wide consultation on RedR UK Urban Competency Framework: RedR UK is producing an Urban Competency Framework (UCF) for humanitarian action. The UCF is produced through funding provided to the International Rescue Committee from EU Humanitarian Aid (ECHO). It is part of a wider project for the Global Alliance for Urban Crises (GAUC) entitled 'Developing the skills to meet the needs of urban populations in crises through the alliance of urban responders'. A first draft (V1) of the UCF has already gone through extensive review resulting in the second draft (V2) which is now shared for review. RedR are inviting other experts in the sector to take part in this consultation process to contribute to and inform the final UCF. The final date for providing input on the consultation is 14 October.

<u>The Path to Housing Recovery', Third Version, September 2018:</u> the latest update to the timeline includes the addition of a new pre-earthquake section which covers 1934 up to just before the Gorkha earthquake. The timeline has also been brought up to date with the addition of a section covering May to September 2018. The conclusion section has been revised based on the points developed for the World Bank stakeholder consultations in July 2018.

<u>Urban housing reconstruction status paper:</u> this status paper has been prepared by HRRP with the objective of providing a snapshot of progress in urban reconstruction to date, the challenges and opportunities in urban reconstruction, and some suggestions for next steps. The document introduces the context, provides photographs of common housing typologies found in urban areas, shares examples of reconstruction issues in urban parts of earthquake affected districts, and provides information about initiatives to address some of these issues.
