Hybrid Structure Research, Developing Annex 2 of the Corrections Manual: technical experts from JICA have recently completed a research field visit to Sindhupalchok and Gorkha to document hybrid structures. This research is now being used as the basis for the NRA technical working group to support preparation of annex 2 of the Corrections and Exceptions Manual which will be focused on remedial measures for hybrid structures.

International Women in engineering day: takes place on 23 June annually and aims to focus attention on women’s role in engineering, and to celebrate the achievements of outstanding women engineers. Shelter Cluster Nepal preparedness Activities 2017/18: the Shelter Cluster Nepal has finalised the key preparedness activities for the year 2017-18, funded by ECHO through a Red Cross Consortium. All national level Shelter Cluster activities will be carried out under the leadership of DUDBC/MoUD and with continuous consultation with all shelter partners and cluster members. The key preparedness activities are: updating the Shelter Cluster Nepal Contingency Plan

2014 to include lessons learnt from the 2015 earthquake response, reviewing the appropriateness of standard Shelter kits and NFIs, carrying out a Shelter Cluster Coordination National Training, providing Shelter Cluster Coordination district level orientations, updating/developing and wider dissemination of hazard based IEC materials on shelter, establishing the National Private Sector platform, District level mapping of open spaces, and desktop Simulation of National Shelter Cluster Contingency Plan.


NRA has launched a Toll-free number (Nepali): the number has been launched with support from UNDP and is 16600172000 (१६६०-०१-७२०००) for NTC and 9801572111 (९८०१५-७२१११) for Ncell. There are 2 people answering the phelines and calls will be answered between 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday to Friday. During off hours, the queries will be recorded. The staff answering the phelines are based in the NRA and source information from NRA Communication team.

NRA Appeal for Expanded Support for Vulnerable Top Ups and Technical Assistance (English, Nepali): The NRA has issued an appeal urging I/NGOs, private sector, and philanthropic organisations to expand support for the vulnerable top up grant of 50,000 NPRs and / or technical assistance. NRA is also asking partners to encourage and support households that have already received the first tranche to finish construction to plinth level and request the second tranche by the middle of June.

Milijuli Nepali, Episode 657: in this episode the presenter talks to the Spokesman of the National Reconstruction Authority (NRA), Mr. Yam Lal Bhusal, about how to make corrections to houses that have already been built but do not meet the building codes, so that they can be eligible for the government grant. In the second section, the presenter talks about what kind of planning is in place to resettle communities displaced by the earthquake.

The Water Data Challenge: eleven Heads of Government and State and Special Adviser who make up the UN/World Bank High Level Panel on Water (HLPW) called for more innovation as part of a fundamental shift in the way the world looks at water. Leaders specifically made an appeal for the launch of challenge events, to stimulate thinking that will shift the needle in implementing a new water agenda. Heeding this call, the Government of Australia and other partners (including the World Bank) are launching the Water Data Challenge. This challenge aims to improve the access to information that is so crucial to ensuring that farmers thrive - especially in lower-income settings - and water resources are managed well.

[Deuba elected as 40th Prime Minister of Nepal:](#) Nepali Congress President, Sher Bahadur Deuba, has been elected as the 40th prime minister of Nepal. Mr. Deuba secured 388 votes out of 593 votes in the parliament. A total of 170 lawmakers voted against him.

[First Cabinet meeting catalogues priorities:](#) according to the Minister for Finance, Gyanendra Karki, five priorities for government were identified; implementation of the constitution, holding local, provincial, and federal elections, expediting reconstruction works, ensuring effective service delivery [to the general public], and maintaining law and order and completing the remaining task of the peace process.

[NRA CEO addresses World Reconstruction Conference:](#) Dr. Govind Raj Pokharel made a keynote speech on 'Early lessons from post-earthquake recovery in Nepal' at the third edition of the World Reconstruction Conference (WRC3) taking place in Brussels from June 6 to 8.

[Orientation program regarding how to operate local levels begins:](#) the Ministry of Federal Affairs and Local Development has conducted the program targeted to the mayors, deputy mayors of the metropolises, sub metropolises and municipalities, chiefs and deputy chiefs of the rural municipalities of the local levels in province No 3. The first phase local poll was held in these local levels on May 14.

[Reconstruction drive in Kavre sees 10 pc progress:](#) around 6,300 houses were rebuilt in the district in the past 10 months since the distribution of the first instalment of the house rebuilding grant assistance.

[Data: A vital tool for disaster response:](#) the American Red Cross and the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) announced a collaboration with Facebook around Disaster Maps that uses aggregated Facebook data to show where communities are located after a disaster, where they are moving, and where they are checking in as 'safe.'

[Workers heading off to Qatar feel nervous \(Nepali\):](#) in the aftermath of the Qatar-Gulf crisis, Nepali migrant workers heading to Qatar are worried about their future. A migrant worker, who has returned after 7 months, mentioned that although the Nepali workers have not been seriously affected, chances are that their salary will be reduced and inflation will go up in the coming days.

[Nepalese women struggling for golden future in Abu Dhabi:](#) around 300 Nepalese women are found working in Abu Dhabi as it is the transit point for going abroad. Of them, some are even found to have left their small kids back home and are struggling for their bright future in Abu Dhabi. Despite the agony of dislocation, women, are found busy in work with a smiling face.

[69,000 sat for Korean language test](#): around 69,000 Nepali youths have appeared in the Korean Language test this year in pursuit to secure jobs through widely acclaimed Employment Permit System (EPS) of the South Korean government.

[Taking Action Based on Community Feedback, 9 May](#): the summary of the meeting held last month is [now available](#) on the HRRP website. Key actions discussed include district coordination working groups for technical assistance staff (government and POs), expand coverage of vulnerable top ups, provide support for households to prepare and approve house designs, establish water supply working group, and communications methods – consider how to include marginalised groups

[AIN meeting, Sindhupalchok, 9 June](#): the DLSA updated about the meeting they had with the LDO and DCC regarding the DCC's roles and mechanism. The LDO requested I/NGOs to maintain neutrality in political activities. Jugal Rural Municipality issued an invitation for a meeting on 14 June. There was an update on a joint monitoring field visit by I/NGOs, which included a visit to the completed District Emergency Operations Centre (DEOC) warehouse where OXFAM will be handing over items of more than 50 lakhs. OXFAM also presented their plan for an integrated settlement for 50-60 IDPs.

[RedR online Urban Humanitarianism training](#): Following the successful launch of RedR's on-line Urban Humanitarianism training in April, the course will be run a second time this year commencing on 3rd July 2017. The Urban Humanitarianism course aims to explore and develop the necessary skills and knowledge of a humanitarian to effectively work in the early stages of an urban emergency.

[Community Q&As published by Earthquake Housing Reconstruction Project, MoFALD CL-PIU \(Nepali\), 9 June:](#) some of the questions included are as follows; Q: What happens if the other half of the assessment slip is lost or the beneficiary didn't receive the slip at all? A: Even if you don't have the slip number, the grant agreement can be made by verifying the serial number and name list. Slip number is not mandatory. Q: I could not fill in the grievance form due to the crowd. When is the last date of grievance registration? A: As of now grievances registration has not been stopped but NRA is thinking of announcing a final date. Q: My name has been included in another VDC. I have corresponded with NRA many times but the address has not been changed. A: The change must go through CL-PIU, NRA, and MoF which is why there is a delay. This will surely be corrected albeit it may take some time. Q: It has been difficult to build a house if the person does not own land. A: If the beneficiary does not own land anywhere inside Nepal then they will be provided with NPRs 200,000 to buy a plot of land. Q: Households who have completed reconstructing their houses are demanding the technical inspection and lumpsum cash grant at the same time. How to deal with this? A: Those houses that are compliant are eligible to receive the cash grant in lump sum. But those houses that need to be corrected must follow the appropriate procedures. The houses must be inspected by the engineers.
