## UPDATES & REQUESTS

### National

**Retrofitting Manual & Inspection Forms:** HRRP technical coordination team are supporting NRA with the development of a retrofitting manual and associated inspection forms. To date, 19,866 households in the 14 districts and 5,119 households in the 17 districts have been identified as eligible to receive the retrofitting grant of 100,000 NPRs. **NRA Technical Working Committee Meeting, 27 July:** the committee met to review the draft manual to address non-compliances in hybrid structures prepared by JICA. The meeting was chaired by NRA Executive Member Dr. Hari Ram Parajuli, and attended by technical experts from NRA, MoUD CL-PIU, IOE, JICA, and HRRP. JICA presented the draft manual and the other committees provided comments and suggestions. The NRA presented typical non-compliances identified at field level. **Shelter Cluster Meeting, 31 July:** chaired by the DUDBC director, the meeting included two presentations; one on the effects of the 2017 monsoon and the monsoon response provided by various agencies, and one preparedness activities under the Shelter Cluster. During the meeting, it was agreed that a 7 member Technical Working Group (TWG) will be formed to work on standardising emergency kits (eg. NFIs, including shelter support during emergency and recovery phase). The Shelter Cluster will send a request mail to identified organisation's to nominate the appropriate person to be part of the TWG this week. The TWG members will need to finalise the ToR for the group, along with specific activities and timeframe, and this will need to be endorsed by DUDBC. [Milijuli Nepali, Episode 698](#): the presenters talk with residents of Jyarbu, Bhimphedi Rural Municipality, Makwanpur whilst working with them in their vegetable field. Whilst working the residents share their concerns related to reconstruction.

[Trends in Urban Resilience 2017, UN Habitat](#): envisioned as a key publication to record the interdisciplinary debates unfolding around the theme of resilience in urban areas, this is a periodic publication that will be updated on a biennial basis. Its production will involve a cyclical mapping exercise of projects, actors, partners, and multi-sectoral practices that contribute to this community of practice. Also from UN Habitat;

[Block by Block](#): also from UN Habitat, this is a collaboration with the developers of the video game 'Minecraft' that utilises Minecraft software as part of participatory community infrastructure planning. This has now been trialed in [many countries, including Nepal](#).

[Women-Centric Approach to Enhance Resilience, ICIMOD, 2017](#): High outmigration of men from Kavre district, Nepal, results in women having to take over the responsibility for farming. They face challenges of decreasing water availability and frequent dry spells, with hardly any support from the outside. The Resilient Mountain Villages approach combines local knowledge and practices with scientific risk and vulnerability assessments, to contribute to disaster risk reduction with simple, affordable and people-driven solutions.

[Inter-Regional Expert Forum on Skills and Migration in the South Asia - Middle East Corridor, 25-26 July](#): attended by over 80 participants from 12 countries – India, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Lebanon, Jordan, Indonesia, Bahrain, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE. During the forum that new research was presented on the impact that skilling has on migrants' wages and working conditions, and also the extent to which migrants are able to transfer their knowledge and skills after returning home from the Middle East. The findings of the forum will shape a number of practical proposals to be carried forward through cooperation at the national, bilateral and regional levels. The outcomes will also feed into the consultations on the [Global Compact on Safe, Regular and Orderly Migration](#).

[Population Situation Analysis of Nepal, UNFPA, July 2017](#): prepared to support integration of core population dynamics issues in the new sustainable development plan of the Government of Nepal to ensure that 'no one is left behind'. This report draws on Nepal's demographic transition and resulting population momentum using key demographic variables for the next 15 years (2016-2030) in the context of the new federal structure of the country.
